

CNHS Small Grants

The Cambridge Natural History Society is willing to make occasional awards of small grants of up to £200 to help research into natural history in the Cambridge area.

The following conditions should be considered by applicants:

- The research may involve any aspect of natural history in its broadest sense. The publication "*The Nature of Cambridge*" gives an indication of the range of topics that might be covered.
- Priority will be given to young or early career scientists who are members of the Society. We consider that anyone investigating natural history is a scientist, however young they may be.
- A grant may be used to help purchase equipment, cover travel costs, pay for specimen analysis, cover publication costs, etc.
- The applicant must make a strong case as to why the CNHS should make a grant and how the grant will be used.
- Applications may be made at any time.
- If an application is successful the work must be written up for one or more of:
 - a paper in *Nature in Cambridgeshire*,
 - a display at the CNHS Conversazione,
 - a presentation during a CNHS evening talk.

Applicants should send their submission to grants@cnhs.org.uk

The application will be assessed by the CNHS Officers and if they recommend acceptance it will then be passed to the full CNHS Council for formal approval. Applicants will usually be notified of the success or otherwise of their application within a month of receipt.
